PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

TWO "GREAT" AMERICAN CATHOLICS NAMED JOHN NEUMANN

Greetings Serrans! Let me tell you about two great people, both immigrants.

January 5 is the feast day of St. John Neumann. He was born in what we now call the Czech Republic, then part of the Austrian empire. He was a child of a faithful Catholic family, and from early boyhood wanted to be ordained. But, the bishop said there were already too many priests in the diocese (!!) and suggested that John should go instead to the American missions, which had too few priests.

Young John did exactly as the bishop suggested. He was ordained a priest in the Redemptorist Order. In the missions he was passionately devoted to serving poor immigrants, especially Italians, Irish, and Germans. He was ultimately appointed fourth bishop of Philadelphia. He founded 41 Catholic schools in his diocese, and he is now regarded as the "Father of the American Catholic school system." He was the first American man to be canonized a saint.

I used quotes in the title of this Message because my second John (Von) Neumann was "great" due to his genius as a mathematician, and not necessarily to his Catholicism.

In the 20th century, there were three brilliant Hungarian Jewish mathematicians who had a profound impact on modern physics: Edward Teller, Eugene Wigner, and John Von Neumann. All three emigrated to America and became American citizens, and during World War II all three worked on the Manhattan Project. John Von Neumann was a pioneer in the development of quantum physics. He created the mathematics that underlay the discovery of DNA. He also invented the digital mathematics which runs the operating systems of all modern computers. Edward Teller, no slouch himself, called him "the smartest man I ever met."

According to his friends, "Johnny" was also a very funny guy.

John Von Neumann was so smart that he became a Catholic. Toward the end of his life he got interested in Catholicism through the influence of a friend, an American Benedictine. After much study and reflection, he finally decided, "Heck, I've got to be Catholic," and was ultimately received into the Church.

What do these two stories have to do with our Serra apostolate? Just this: they illustrate the strength and vibrancy of the American Catholic Church. We are a Church of immigrants, for immigrants. As I write this, and as we have our monthly meetings, new immigrants filled with the Holy Spirit are reinvigorating our churches, our schools, our convents, and our seminaries. With God's help, we can be part of their spiritual support. Viva Cristo Rey!

HERMITAGE RETREAT CENTER

Tom Pomeroy and his wife, Carrie, are the newest members of our Serra Club. Tom shared with us his experience and call into ministry at Pacem in Terris. After 35 years working in the secular world in a variety of accounting/finance and project management roles, he found himself, in the Fall of 2015, at his first ever silent retreat and it was at Pacem in Terris. Within twenty hours of leaving from his hermitage at Pacem, the Holy Spirit rushed in like a November wind answering his prayers. He spent two and a half years serving at Pacem in Terris. Tom talked about how Pacem in Terris can help us all draw closer to our Lord, enriching our spiritual life, and fostering vocations in the Church.

The Pacem in Terris hermitage is located less than forty minutes north of the Twin Cities. It provides a wonderful opportunity to pilgrimage to a peaceful place of silence and solitude that is invigorating for your spirit. What is a hermitage? A hermitage is a holy dwelling, blessed by God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Holy Mary, the Blessed Mother of Jesus, and the heavenly community of angels and saints delight in your presence. At your invitation, they will pray with you, and you will be blessed by their love and support.

The mission seeks to be a channel of God's peace in the world and welcomes all faiths. It is a Franciscan center of spirituality that welcomes guests who seek to be alone with God. As a community committed to living the gospel of Jesus Christ, they provide a simple restful environment where you can respond to God's call to **"Be still and know that I am God."** Psalm 46:10 (11)

The prayerful solitude of a simple hermitage, nestled in the beauty of a wooded setting, provides an opportunity for God to heal, nourish, and restore His people. He delights in us as we approach Him with grateful hearts, offer Him praise and thanksgiving, and intercede for the needs of our family, friends, community, and the world.

Besides the hermitage being a beautiful, quiet place away from all distractions, a pilgrim will be in the hands of an excellent spiritual director during their retreat.

Since 1987, Pacem in Terris has been welcoming hermits who have pilgrimaged from all parts of the world. It has been the same for every hermit. You enter your hermitage to be alone with God, and you surrender your will to Him. It is then that He will lead you.

VOCATIONS BUS TRIP

The Buses arrived at St. Charles Borromeo per plan at 8:15am on a sunny Wednesday morning. Twenty eighth grade girls along with chaperones Vicki Paine, teacher, Katie Walker, youth director, and MaryAnne met the students. We directed the boys and girls to their buses. The buses were to pick up additional students at Immaculate Conception School. But, for the girls, it soon became apparent that the bus driver was taking the 'scenic route!' As the driver headed east and south on Old Highway 88, we had him pull up by the St Anthony Dairy Queen to recheck his GPS. (The girls were disappointed the store was closed). After safely arriving at Immaculate Conception School, we welcomed thirteen more students along with Bridget Knisely, teacher and chaperone. As the girls settled into the bus, Father Matthew Quail came aboard and gave us his blessing along with supportive words to be attentive to how God calls each of us. Sister Joseph Marie welcomed us warmly as we arrived at the Little Sisters of the Poor. After showing a video about St. Jeanne Jugan and the beginnings of the Sisters and sharing her vocation story, we met Sisters Paul, Mary Therese, Amy and Mary Pasqual. A number of sisters shared their own vocation stories on a more individual basis. Each resonated a beautiful joy, reflective of their "fiat" to God's call. The girls had the opportunity to interact with many residents. They played games and helped to put a challenging puzzle together. Mass was celebrated mid-day in the Chapel and a student from each school participated by reading the Epistle and Antiphons. We wait with anticipation, the essays that the students write to share their experience and to hopefully find that a seed has been planted.

Sixteen boys boarded the bus at St. Charles Borromeo School along with an 8th grade teacher, Michael Hartnett, and North-Minneapolis Serra chaperones, Matt Bona and Ken Cobian. A student's parent, Nick Corbett, also assisted as a chaperone for the boys. At Immaculate Conception School, eight 8th grade boys boarded, along with Father Matthew Quail. He gave his blessing to those on the bus and then we proceeded to St. John Vianney Seminary on the University of St. Thomas campus. When the boys settled into their seats, Ken gave a brief description of the day's itinerary with heavy emphasis on being respectful and paying close attention to the speakers.



At SJV Seminary we were greeted by two seminarians: Gregory Maloney, a college junior seminarian from St Charles Borromeo parish, and Lucien, a freshman seminarian, from Chicago. Another junior seminarian, Jacob, met the group in the lobby outside the Chapel and pointed out the beautiful mosaics in the hallway. He then led the group into the chapel and explained the altar layout and the beautiful religious artistry of paintings and statues. Each of the three seminarians talked about their discernment experiences. Greg outlined what a day is like for a seminarian at SJV. Jacob and Lucien then led the group of boys on a tour of the campus, which included the Anderson Athletic Complex, football field, and the Student Union, then across Summit Avenue and past the Science and Engineering Buildings, ending up at the Saint Paul Seminary (SPS).

At SPS, the boys were greeted by Father Mark Pavlak, Archdiocesan Director of Vocations, and were escorted to the St. Olaf Room where we ate lunch. After lunch, the boys were escorted to St. Mary's Chapel where Deacon Sebastian Spencer, Theology IV Seminarian from St. Charles Borromeo parish, and Elias Budke, Theology II Seminarian from St. Timothy parish in Maple Lake, spoke to the students.

We took a quick walk across campus to attend Mass at the St. Thomas Aquinas Chapel. Following the Mass we boarded the bus where the boys were reminded that their essay should include how the Holy Spirit moved them during their vocation tour.

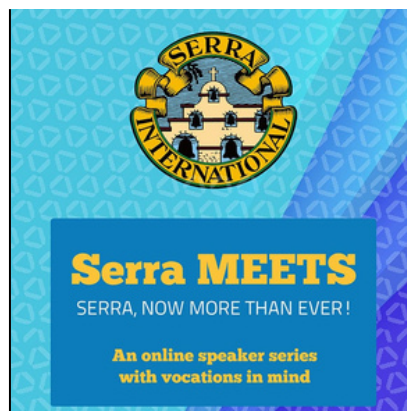
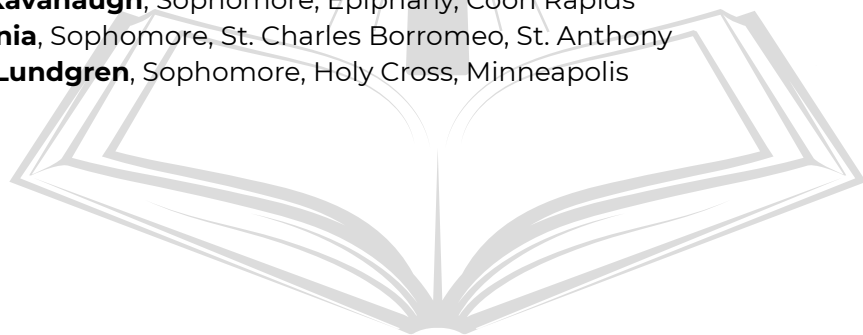

Meeting Opened with prayer led by **President T Regan** at 8:50 am. Minutes from the previous meeting on 11/18/25 were moved, seconded, and approved. **K Cobian** relayed a warm hello from homebound Serran **Joe Spano**.

VOCATIONS VP: MA Frank began her report with an inspiration from **J Makowske** who told us about finding a beautifully done brochure at our recent Serran retreat entitled the "Rosary for Vocations" - Reflections on the Luminous Mysteries by Vianney Vocations Press. She distributed copies and explained how each of the luminous mysteries is set up for one type of vocation. **MA Frank** ordered 50 copies for us to use. **J McGuire** told how he has already used this brochure to pray with students who read aloud from it on his recent vocational field trip to the Franciscan Brothers of Peace. The brochure is a good example of a nugget found by attending retreats. Next, **Vicky Osborne** and **Loretta Thielen** presented our Christmas gifts to **Patty McQuillan**, the Vocations Office Coordinator for **Fr Pavlak** at SPS and secretary **Savannah** at SJV. **Fr Kelly** came to share his gratitude for our annual gifts which are very meaningful to the seminarians. **Vicky Osborne** will oversee arrangements for next year's delivery of seminary gifts and accord this pleasurable volunteer opportunity to newer Serrans. Next, six volunteers are needed (trying to incorporate new members) for the annual Miriam Dinner on Jan 27. Lastly, **MA Frank** brought Christmas cards for **Loretta Thielen** who is in charge of outreach, sending out cards for illness, anniversaries, etc to priests and Serrans as has been done so beautifully over many years by homebound Serran **Michaeline Loomis**. **MA Frank** asked board members to sign and give the cards to their pastors, on behalf of our Serra Club. **M Collins** inquired about the availability of posters: they can be obtained at the SPS. The Archdiocese mailed posters to individual parishes this year, in lieu of being delivered by Serrans.

COMMUNICATIONS VP: J Makowske asks for everyone's indulgence of a very early deadline for Newsletter submittals this month. She will be delighted to receive information from each VP this week. There will be a new feature prompted by **MA Frank** each month for holy days which have a special indulgence available to Serrans. Also, a list of seminarians and religious from our charter area will be printed in order that we are reminded to pray for them. Lastly, **J Makowske** voiced concern that progress is not being made on our website. Web designer **Mary Krawczynski** is awaiting content before going live, such as basic documentation about the standing committees. The Newsletters have already been added. She needs basic questions answered: why does Serra want a website; who is it for; and what is the bandwidth (the usage speed for access/downloads, etc). **President T Regan** would like to volunteer for the committee because he has changed his mind about having a website after being in San Diego and trying in vain to connect with a Serra Club online.

VOCATION BUS TRIP VPs: Mark Eastham and J McGuire: J McGuire talked about securing the essays from students who were on the fall bus trips.
